David Garrison, Overseer Wyatt or any three of them be  
appointed Commissioners, to sell the Slaves Belonging to  
the estate of the said William Matthews and upon a  
credit ~~of~~ <sup>on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of December next,</sup> after giving  
public notice of the time, and place of such sale, and  
that they take bond with approved security from the pur-  
chasers thereof, and that they pay over to the ad-  
ministrator a sufficient sum of money, for the payment  
of the remaining debts, due from the estate of his master  
to his creditors, and that she divide the residue equally  
between the complainants, and the infant defendant  
after allotting to the widow her, dower thereof, to be held  
by her during her life only: and that in such division  
the debts due from the distributees to the administrator  
are the debts for which the estate thence found, as their  
security, the Commissioners shall take into estimation  
and charge such distributees, with such debts, as a pay-  
ment so far as they will go, of their proportion of the  
residue of the said Slaves: and that they take <sup>the</sup>  
bond with security to be approved of by the said ~~consent~~  
that the widow at her death, or her representatives, will  
return to the said estate her part of the residue of the  
said Slaves, and that they take bond <sup>Security</sup> from the  
complainants, and the guardian of the infant defendant  
to refund their proportionable part of any debts which may  
hereafter appear to be due from the said estate which  
may remain unpaid, & that they make report of them providing
